

We are using CDC, local, state, and government suggested guidance to build the best plan to ensure everyone a safe and fun camp experience. Like you, we are continuing to monitor developments regarding the COVID-19 outbreak closely. Here are the procedures we will institute for camp to keep our kids & teams safe: All campers and staff will be temperature-checked, and we will ask a set of questions about their recent health at the time arrival. Establishing and maintaining a safe and healthy camp experience remains our top priority. In addition to the many steps we take every day to protect the health of our guests, campers, and staff, we are working closely with our board of directors to ensure that. We will be keeping parents updated on key decisions regarding changes to our programming and safety protocols. We will be adjusting protocols as required per CDC and Health department guidelines, so we ask in advance for your patience as processes change accordingly. We hope you understand that while we will do our best to keep your child safe there is always a risk when gathering in large groups. We are going to use the best wisdom God has given us to have fun but also lots of Lysol wipes. While camp may be a little different this year we are excited to see what God has in store.

Drop off.

Parents will have to drop their children off in the field without entering the dorm buildings. Families will be encouraged to have one parent drop the child off. Each camper and staff will have their temperatures can be taken at arrival. Normal temperature should not exceed 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit. Anyone with a temperature above 100.4 will NOT be allowed to stay.

The following questions will be asked of each camper and Staff upon arrival

Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days?

Are you experiencing a cough, shortness of breath or sore throat?

Have you had a fever in the last 48 hours?

Have you had new loss of taste or smell?

Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours?

Have you had a Sore throat?

Have you experienced any body Shakes or chills?

Campers will be sleeping head-to-toe to ensure distance between their faces.

Fans will be added to give more air flow.

The number of people in the bathroom facilities will be limited to two people at a time reduce spread of the virus within those confined spaces. Showers will be one camper at a time alternating between stalls, Stalls to be sanitized between each uses.

Dorm staff will be cleaning sanitizing and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces in dorms

Each camper and staff will have a designated area to keep personal belongings separate from each other's belongings.
